Dear Municipality of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands,

NEMI has been a great ally over the years to continually host Pride Manitoulin events during the month of August. We hope to continue this established relationship and are asking for your support again this year from Thursday, August 8<sup>th</sup> to Sunday, August 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

We would like to formally request the use of Low Island for our Pride Foam Party Concert on Friday, August 9<sup>th</sup> from 5:00pm-11:30pm. Historically, it rains on the second weekend in August so in preparation of any inclement weather, we would like to erect a large tent on the NEMI soccer field area. WEATHER OBSERVATIONS	
Temp	Temperature is a measurement of the outside air temperature. It is measured in degrees Celsius.
RH	Relative humidity is a way of describing how much humidity there is in the air. It is measured as a percentage from 0 – 100%.
Dir	Dir is the direction in which the wind is <u>coming from</u> shown in degrees on the compass from 0 – 360
WS	WS stands for “wind speed” which measures the velocity which the air is traveling in an open area.
AdWS	AdWS stands for “adjusted wind speed” same as above only adjusted for forested lands.
Rain	Rain is a measurement of how much rainfall has been measured at a weather station. It is measured in millimeters often referred to as “mills”. This reading gives an estimate to how much rain has fallen in the area surrounding a weather station.

  

WEATHER INDICIES	
FFMC	The Fine Fuel Moisture Code (FFMC) is a numeric rating of the moisture content of litter and other cured fine fuels. This code is an indicator of the relative ease of ignition and the flammability of fine fuel.
DMC	The Duff Moisture Code (DMC) is a numeric rating of the average moisture content of loosely compacted organic layers of moderate depth. This code gives an indication of fuel consumption in moderate duff layers and medium-size woody material.
DC	The Drought Code (DC) is a numeric rating of the average moisture content of deep, compact organic layers. This code is a useful indicator of seasonal drought effects on forest fuels and the amount of smoldering in deep duff layers and large logs.
ISI	The Initial Spread Index (ISI) is a numeric rating of the expected rate of fire spread. It combines the effects of wind and the FFMC on rate of spread without the influence of variable quantities of fuel.
BUI	The Buildup Index (BUI) is a numeric rating of the total amount of fuel available for combustion. It combines the DMC and the DC.
FWI	The Fire Weather Index (FWI) is a numeric rating of fire intensity. It combines the Initial Spread Index and the Buildup Index. It is suitable as a general index of fire danger throughout the forested areas of Canada.

The total value of construction value to date is **\$4,790,000.00** with a total building department revenue of **\$60,954.00**.
