Whereas the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands and the Manitoulin Island experienced one of the hardest winters with the highest levels of snow fall in recent years and;

Whereas majority of the Manitoulin Island suffered from some level of flooding during the week of April 13, 2026 due to a heavy rain fall and snow melt and;

Whereas the Sandfield Damn was not opened until during or shortly after the main event had taken place, therefor affecting a large number of communities, houses, businesses and roads;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands urges the MNR to be more mindful of potential future weather conditions and open the dam earlier in the spring in order to ensure that the added volumes of released water do not add to the spring melt conditions and contribute to flooding.
